Public Meetings Set to Gather Public Comment on Proposed Projects and Share Construction Updates

SAN ANTONIO (May 27, 2025) – The [Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization \(AAMPO\)](#) will host six public meetings this June to gather feedback on transportation projects and programs competing for \$256 million in funding. The [Texas Department of Transportation \(TxDOT\)](#) will join to provide updates on major highway projects, including US 90, I-35, I-10, and Loop 1604.

Public comment is a critical part of AAMPO's funding recommendation process. AAMPO's Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) considers feedback from the public for determining funding recommendations to AAMPO's Transportation Policy Board (TPB) Executive Committee. The process also considers technical score, agency priority, public input, and project development status (readiness) as well as financial constraints.

Projects selected for funding will be included in AAMPO's FY [2027–2030 Transportation Improvement Program \(TIP\)](#), which lists programs and construction projects planned over four years. These projects and programs will also be reflected in AAMPO's long-range [Metropolitan Transportation Plan \(MTP\)](#), and the [2026 Transportation Conformity Determination](#). All three of these documents will be reviewed by TAC and TPB in April 2026 and considered for approval in May 2026.

“The public's thoughts and opinion are essential in determining our region's transportation priorities,” said Sonia Jiménez, Interim Executive Director at AAMPO. “These meetings are a chance for community members to learn about what's happening now with TxDOT's highway projects and to help shape what's next by weighing in on projects that directly affect their daily travel, their communities, and our shared future.”

The public is encouraged to attend one of the meetings listed below or comment online from June 1 – 30, 2025 at alamoareampo.org/yourmove. Multiple locations and dates are available to provide convenient access for community members throughout the region. The [Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization \(AAMPO\)](#) facilitates a comprehensive, cooperative, and continuous (3Cs) transportation planning process across Bexar, Comal, and Guadalupe counties, as well as a portion of Kendall County. We partner with governments, businesses, nonprofits and others across 68 cities and 4 counties to serve over 2.4 million residents and promote the safe and efficient movement of people and goods throughout our region.

Guided by the Transportation Policy Board (TPB), AAMPO allocates federal and state transportation funds across the region, with public input playing a crucial role in these decisions. The TPB is advised by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and Active Transportation Advisory Committee (ATAC). AAMPO has served as the federally designated metropolitan planning organization for the San Antonio-Bexar



County region since 1977, maintaining an annual planning program of studies and developing both long-range and short-range transportation plans.
