**AAMPO Invites Public Input
on \$1.9 Billion Transportation Improvement Program**

SAN ANTONIO, TX (March 17, 2026) - The Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO) is inviting the public to attend a series of public meetings to review and comment on the Draft FY 2027–2030 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

The draft TIP outlines transportation projects and programs totaling more than \$1.9 billion and are scheduled to move into construction/implementation over the next four years. These efforts make up the TIP, the agency’s short-range program that guides investments in roadway improvements, safety enhancements, mobility solutions, and multimodal transportation options throughout the Alamo Area region. Public input is a critical part of the planning process, giving residents the opportunity to learn about projects affecting their area, ask questions, and provide feedback before the plan is finalized.

“Your voice matters now more than ever! With the Alamo region expected to grow to nearly 2.8 million people by 2030, the Transportation Policy Board is relying on input from residents and community leaders to guide the next four-year funding program. Together, we can prioritize projects that improve safety, mobility, and quality of life for everyone in our rapidly growing region,” said Brendon Wheeler, AAMPO Executive Director.

The [Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization \(AAMPO\)](#) facilitates a comprehensive, cooperative, and continuous transportation planning process across Bexar, Comal, Guadalupe, and Kendall counties, as well as the eastern portion of Medina County and the City of Lytle. The agency partners with governments, businesses, nonprofits and community stakeholders to serve over 2.4 million residents and promote the safe and efficient movement of people and goods throughout the region.

Guided by the Transportation Policy Board (TPB), AAMPO allocates federal transportation funds across the region with public input playing a crucial role in these decisions. The TPB is advised by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and Active Transportation Advisory Committee (ATAC). AAMPO has served as the federally designated metropolitan planning organization for the San Antonio-Bexar County region since 1977, maintaining an annual planning program of studies and developing long-range plans and short-range transportation programs. The agency is also responsible for mitigating mobile-source emissions related to Bexar County's non-attainment air quality status for ozone.
